### Preview on the Pavement

Maybe you saw the HomeZone launch in Broughton Road on the TV or in the paper now there's a video of Home Zones on the continent where they've been doing it for years.

You are invited to a preview of 'At Home in My Street' which tells the tale of HomeZones in the Netherlands & Germany. The video follows a study tour taken by UK town planners to the countries and aims to give a good insight into what they're really like and what can be achieved.

If you want to know more about HomeZones this is the ideal opportunity. If you have doubts or questions this is an occasion to ask or air your views. Residents of the Five Roads are invited to bring a chair and refreshments to watch the video and find out how the campaign is going. It takes place in Denmark Road this Friday (Sept 3) on the pavement between nos 10 and 8 at 6.30pm

#### **Government Minister makes announcement from Broughton Road**

The Government announced on August 4 that the Five Roads Forum is to be one of the first HomeZones in the country. To mark the occasion transport minister Lord Whitty visited Ealing's Broughton Road to take tea with the residents. The street was closed to traffic and in its place chairs and tables arranged. The Council also erected a marquee
