HomeZone Designer appointed

If you have noticed various surveying teams taking sightline measurements in the past few days it was probably one of the competing design organizations hoping to win the contract. On Monday after much deliberation, the HomeZone Project Board of residents, Council officers and Councillor Peter Wickes chose Groundwork West London to undertake the urban and landscape design work for the five roads.

This important step which will pave the way for residents to be involved in the re-design of our streets follows Ealing Council's appointment of Rachel Felton as HomeZone Project Manager. Rachel established the Project Board for the pilot Home Zone. "This will provide a more balanced and structured approach," says Rachel who joined the council in March:

Revised Timetable

Groundwork West London the new designers will consult with the council's traffic engineers Parkman and draw up a selection of different schemes under guidance from the project board. Another open meeting will be arranged in June to invite all to comment.

Residents' involvement

Revised plans including feedback from residents at the open meeting will be drawn up and then every

Monitoring of our roads will be done by the Transport Research Laboratories on behalf of the Department for the Environment, Transport and the Regions (DETR) starting in the autumn. This will involve Resident interviews, children keeping diaries, air monitoring, and traffic flow studies.

Speed

The Department of Environment, Transport and the Regions has said it would consider sanctioning 10mph speed limits in pilot
