Please join us at this important meeting. It's your chance to find out more about what's going on in your local area, with reports on planning, transport and the environment. We'll be keeping you informed about key issues like plans for the Daniel's site at the end of Broughton Road. Overleaf is a brief update on some of the issues, to give you a flavour of what goes on. This meeting is an opportunity for you to meet other residents, to find out what's been going on in the past year, to raise any issues that concern you, or to suggest any ideas for fund raising or social activities. We also have some money to spend, so ideas on how to do that would be welcome. As usual we have an invited speaker at the meeting. This year, it's Councillor David Millican, who will speak about (and take questions on) the Council's plans for regeneration in the Borough, particularly around our patch in West Ealing. We will have the AGM for our Neighbourhood Watch at the same time, and our Ealing Broadway Ward Safer Neighbourhood Team will be in attendance.

At this meeting we will be electing new FRF officers for 2009 - including street representatives, secretary, treasurer and chair. We desperately need new blood. If you might be interested, but are unsure and want to find out more about what's involved before committing yourself to this, feel free to contact one of the current committee, whose names and contact numbers are on the back of this newsletter.

At last year's AGM , the speaker was PC Tony Frampton, our local PCSO. He has reported back to us with an update: *"It was a pleasure to meet many of the residents of the Five Roads Neighbourhood Watch Area during our letter drop recently. Over 600 letters were delivered, but it is a good opportunity once again to remind everyone to keep their windows locked, security and internal lights on and alarms set for winter. Specifically for the Five Roads residents, keeping valuable items out of your vehicles is important. We are launching a new initiative in the town centre to reduce theft from handbags. Please help by ensuring that yours are secure and fastened at all times, and not hanging on the back of pushchairs or coffee house seats!"* Tony also wanted to mention that he's only had a limited response regarding new Neighbourhood Watch recruits. UPDATE: PLANNING ISSUES from Lisa Hall

Most of you will be aware of the PCT plans to relocate the Mattock Lane surgery on the Daniel's site. The change in use from a department store to a medical facility has necessitated changes in the lease agreements with the flats above the site to reflect this. This process is expected to be completed soon, and a formal application from the PCT should be forthcoming early in the New Year. We have been in discussion with the PCT concerning parking arrangements for the planned development, to ensure that the impact on the Five Roads is minimised.

We will be pressing for a re-consultation on the hours of our local CPZ once the PCT plans are clarified. Funds have been earmarked for this.

A planning application for a house in the 'alley' on the south side of Denmark Road is due to be heard in the next few days, so we'll be able to report on the outcome of this at the AGM.

DID YOU KNOW

that Broughton Court was built in the 1950s on the site of two World War II bomb blasts - a parachute mine in December 1940 and a V1 bomb in July 1944? The mine resulted in major loss of life.
