RESULTS OF CPZ RECONSULTATION

In July, we were reconsulted about whether we thought the existing hours of our controlled parking zone would be adequate when the new Mattock Lane Clinic opened in the former Daniel site. The response was clear.

Thank you to the 131 residents who took the time to respond to the Council's consultation document. As a result, it has been recommended that our CPZ hours and days change to ensure residents have a place to park when the new Mattock Lane Clinic opens. A majority of you said you would like the hours drastically extended, and even more of you said the CPZ should also operate on Saturday. In market research terms, the response was overwhelming.

We have agreed with our Councillors, since the planning application has not yet been submitted for the new Mattock Lane Clinic, that the implementation of new CPZ hours will be deferred until it is absolutely clear from the NHS Trust what the Clinic's opening hours will be. However, our Councillors have agreed that our new CPZ hours will be extended and will reflect the opening hours of the Clinic, which is what the majority of residents said they wanted.

We anticipate that the new hours, once they are finalised, will be something like:

Monday to Friday 9am—7pm

Saturday 9am—12noon

This assumes Clinic opening times of 8am—8pm Monday to Friday, and 8am—12noon on Saturday. Residents will receive a formal notice from the Council before any new hours go into effect, but do not expect to see changes until some time after work starts on the new Clinic hopefully next year.

There will, however, be improvements made to the overall parking layout to provide a number of additional resident car parking spaces. These will come from remarking some of the oversized diagonal parking spaces and reclaiming disused loading and disabled bays, and should be completed by December.

The NHS Trust have told us they hope to submit a planning application early in the New Year for the new Mattock Lane Clinic on the Daniel site, which will then take about a year to fit out.

PM Gallery & House, Ealing's flagship cultural venue, includes the Grade I listed Pitzhanger Manor House, designed by the architect John Soane in 1800 and PM Gallery, West London's premier professional contemporary arts venue which welcomes over 30,000 visitors each year.

Foxes — URBAN LEGEND or MENACE?

We have recently heard many tales of foxes coming into houses through first floor windows and cat flaps, destroying leather shoes and handbags, and attacking pet rabbits and chickens. Love them or hate them, there is little we can do to keep them away other than simply discourage them.

Clean up areas of your garden that are attractive to foxes — piles of rubbish, food on the compost pile, bird seed and garden manure, etc. **DO NOT FEED FOXES!** Fix holes under your fence and block up possible den sites under sheds and decks to keep foxes from settling in. You must be vigilant in keeping these areas cleared. Also use proven chemical deterrent products such as "Scoot" and "Get Off My Garden", available at garden centres.

If your neighbours are using deterrent methods but you are not, YOU are the one that will end up with all the foxes! We must all work together for deterrent methods to be effective in encouraging foxes that another territory would be more attractive than our back gardens.

Update on Five Roads Planning Issues

We have recently had re-confirmation that the Ealing Primary Care Trust does in fact plan to relocate the Mattock Lane Clinic into the former Daniel's site. Delay in putting forward a planning application has been due in part to changes which are being made to the lease agreements with the flats above the site, and in part to a re-evaluation by the PCT as to what facilities should operate within the new clinic. We will continue to discuss options with the PCT to ensure that impact on the Five Roads is minimised, and will keep you informed.

A planning application for a house in the 'alley' on the south side of Denmark Road was approved earlier this year, but no work has started. The agent for the owner informed us that they intend to put forward a further application before construction actually begins. Watch this space!

DID YOU KNOW : The West Ealing train station was opened in 1871 as "Castle Hill and Ealing Dene" station, but not until some 33 years after the Great Western Railway line came through! *Find out lots more about our local history on the Five Roads website.*
